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Thesis: Teach a few basic grooves and patterns; then let the students imagination take over


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
- 1. Basic Movement Grooves
- 2. Group Patterns
- 3. Arranging

Things to Remember

- Composition: Give students specific rhythms via notation or chanting
- Have students accompany movement grooves with One Bucket Grooves, Group Grooves, or Unisons
- If you don't have enough buckets, have students "air bucket," take turns, or incorporate a hand off
- Combine small group compositions into a larger piece
- Give students an opportunity to work in large ensemble, duos, trios, quartets, and solo
